

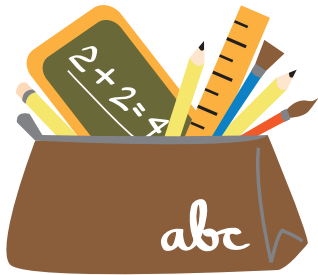

Vaccines

UNICEF buys more vaccines (the shots and drops kids get to stay healthy) than any organization in the world.

In 2010 alone, UNICEF bought 2.3 billion doses of vaccines for children and moms.



Education

Globally, 69 million kids miss out on the chance to go to primary school. But UNICEF is working to change that by building schools, providing millions of children with school supplies, and training teachers — so every child can have the chance to learn.

Safe, Clean Water

About 900 million people worldwide don't have access to safe, clean drinking water. Drinking unclean water makes kids sick — it can even kill them. But since 1990, UNICEF and its partners have already helped 1.6 billion people get safe drinking water.

Better Nutrition

Worldwide, more than one-quarter of children under age five don't have enough to eat. That means they don't grow the way they should. UNICEF provides foods, vitamins, and nutrients to help make sure children can thrive.



- There are nearly 7 billion people in the world. About a third of them are children.
- Each day, children all over the world die from completely preventable causes — like not having food or medicine or clean drinking water.
- 1 billion children in the world live in poverty. That means they are often hungry, they may have to work instead of going to school, and their whole family may live in a single room.
- UNICEF is working in over 150 countries to help give all children the basics for a healthy, safe, educated childhood.
